Thank you to everyone who took action in the recent campaign to improve transfer of credit recognition for graduates of nationally accredited schools. Our accrediting agency, the DETC, has been a driving force over the last decade to end discrimination in transfer of credit between regionally accredited and nationally accredited schools.

Thanks to the letters of support from students, graduates, and College officials, there has been success in the Senate on this issue. On July 24, the full Senate passed the Higher Education Amendments of 2007 and eliminated the language the DETC objected to in regard to transfer of credit. The final bill passed now requires schools to publish their criteria for acceptable transfer of credit. This is a small victory for nationally accredited schools. We will keep all alumni informed as updates on this issue become available. Thank you again for all of your support!

Herb 201 Student Karen Herget Emmenagogue Herbs, An Essay

I am very personally interested in emmenagogue herbs at this time, since I seem to be passing through one of my major biological life stages, menopause.

I confess this is not a particularly interesting phase of life. My major thought about the process is, "Please be over soon!

Many of us often feel as though <u>life</u> may be passing us by, but <u>Time</u> passes no one by. In fact, Time often sucks us along, kicking and screaming, despite our best efforts not to go.

The passage of Time is discernable most notably by common hallmarks that signify movement from one phase of human life to the next. These life passages can be identified as social or biological stages.

Social stages include: advancing through educational or professional levels, becoming a parent and later a grandparent, or establishing and dissolving relationships and bonds. We have some control over social changes and we can make choices.

Biological life passages are not normally a matter of choice. Our bodies mature through a series of changes over which we have no control. We must often simply suffer through each change and celebrate attainment of our new status. Biological changes are a process and follow set courses.

Men and women experience changes throughout their lives. Some people are more sensitive emotionally to changes, others experience extremes in physical response to common changes.
